INTRODUCTION

Twenty years may be a long time but it seems to have gone quickly, and we all still have vivid memories of our undergraduate years and graduation in the Faculty of Medicine, Monash University.

The Faculty has implemented almost all the changes recommended by the Medical Education Reform Group initiated by many of our colleagues in 1974. The curriculum underwent major changes again in 1991 with clinical experience in all six years of the course, much greater emphasis on clinical and communication skills, and community and rural practice, and a final year assessment process spread equally over 5th and 6th years. The Faculty has also introduced a selection interview process, which is scored equivalent to two extra subjects, for entry in to the course. Sydney, Queensland and Flinders Universities have gone for graduate entry into a 4 year course, though Monash is to remain a 6 year course aimed at school leavers.

As an indication of the high standard achieved by the Faculty in curriculum reform, the Australian Medical Council (AMC) approved the course for a maximum of 10 years following a thorough review process in 1993.

The 20 Year Reunion Committee has again worked hard to create an interesting and entenaining program on November 11, 12 and 13, 1994.

This magazine completes the trilogy of: Final Year; 10 Year Reunion; and 20 Year Reunion publications, which, in this format, is unique for Monash Medical Graduates.

The fax machine has been my saviour in compiling all the names and biographies. Despite hundreds of letters, telephone calls, faxes and committee meetings, I haven't been able to track down everyone.

Graduates are arranged this time in alphabetical order comprising those who either commenced the course in 1969 or joined us along the way and graduated in 1974,

I wish to thank you all for contributions and photographs.

For those graduates whose names do not appear, I apologise. Some have specifically requested not to be included and for others I could not find any reliable information.
